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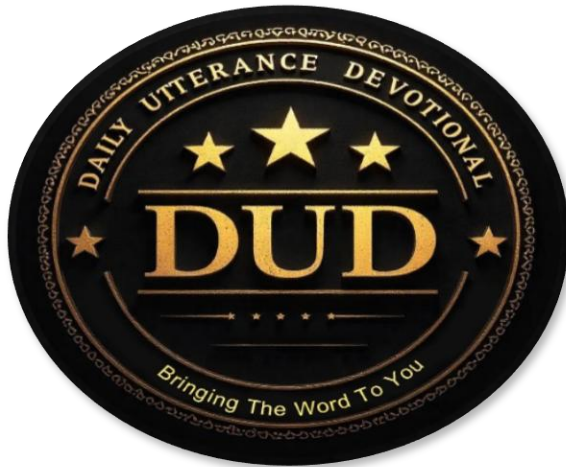

THE LAW OF DILIGENCE (PART 1)

Proverbs 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men.

Diligence is the combination of carefulness and long-lasting efforts to get things done very well. Diligence carries a note of zeal and enthusiasm.

There are key questions to consider when discussing diligence and some are highlighted below;

1. Do I complete my assigned task promptly with enthusiasm?
2. Do I plan ahead of the work/task I am assigned to?
3. Am I consistent in performing my tasks?
4. Am I discreet in discharging my duties?
5. Can I work under pressure with little or no supervision?

As a Christian, you must strive to be diligent in the fulfilling of your divine assignment/purpose in life, assigned tasks in Church, your career/job, among others.

Christians must be so diligent that we become indispensable in whatever mountain of influence we are called to. In our anchor scripture, the Bible shows us the end of a diligent man (***he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men***). Inevitably, we will enjoy good success if we are diligent.

Hebrews 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Ephesians 5:16 Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

Diligence is one of the key laws for success. In our first anchor scripture, we observe that the diligent lives in plenteousness. In our second anchor scripture, we observe that God even rewards them that diligently seek Him. Diligence is the steering wheel for receiving awards and rewards in this life. At all cost, fight to be diligent in any good thing your hand finds to do.

In our third anchor scripture, Apostle Paul admonished the Church of Ephesians to buy time. The time used in this scripture is the Greek word ***“kairos”*** which means a set time or due season or opportune time. In other words, when you buy ***“kairos”*** time,

you buy opportunities. We should utilize the opportunity we have now to be alive. We should achieve more in the shortest possible time for the days are evil. In fact, time is not on our side. We are in the last days. God is counting on us to do more for His kingdom.

Ecclesiastes 9:10 Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.

Lamentations 3:27 It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth.

In our previous studies, we understood what diligence is all about and some benefits we get from being diligent. In today's study we will consider one major reason why we have to be diligent at all cost. In our anchor scripture, King Solomon revealed that, the main reason why we have to be diligent in whatever we do is because of time. Time is the most precious commodity on earth. When you lose time, you have really lost something precious. Most people do not realize that there is a time given for each person to fulfil his divine assignment on earth and as such there is going to be a day where one will have to give an account of what he or she used his/her time for. It is worthy to note here that, a dying man may not need a car or a house but an additional time to live on the earth.

It is therefore important to consider what our second anchor scripture tells us to do. We must bear the yoke (the burden of your divine assignment) in our youth. In other words, there is a labour dimension attached to the fulfilling of your divine purpose on earth and as such it is expedient to pay that price in the days of your youth. If you are a youth, listen to wisdom so that you do not waste the best season of your life on things that will not contribute to your becoming in life and destiny

There are wonderful benefits from being diligent. In our first anchor scripture, we observe that diligence takes one to the top. We must reject every form of mediocrity and fight to be at the top. This is the only way we can win the world for Christ. Kings will not just come to our light but they will come to the brightness of our rising. Let us be so diligent that kings will look for us. In our second anchor scripture, diligence is one of the keys for creating and maintaining wealth. Wealth is important for

Christians because of kingdom agenda. The kingdom can spread across the world through prosperity (***Zechariah 1:17 Cry yet, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; My cities through prosperity shall yet be spread abroad; and the LORD shall yet comfort Zion, and shall yet choose Jerusalem***). It takes a lot of finances to carry the gospel to other territories. We have to be diligent to create and maintain wealth. Laziness breeds poverty. Awake from your slumber and become diligent in every good work in Christ.

Proverbs 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men.

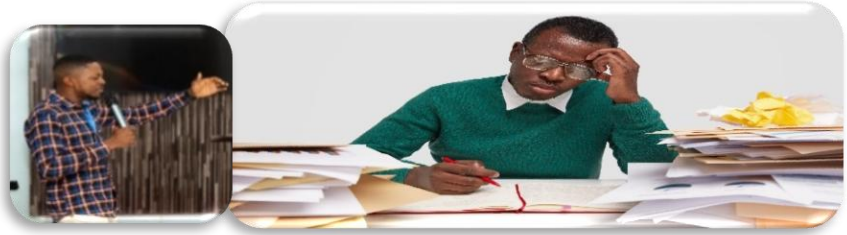
Diligence is a very important key to remain a success in life. In this series, we want to learn how we can become diligent in whatever good work we are doing. Some keys are elaborated below;

- 1. Ensure proper time management:** The Psalmist knew the value of time so he prayed to God in *Psalms 90:12* “*So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom*”. The word “*number*” in this text is from the Hebrew word “*manah*” which means to allot or schedule. The Psalmist then was praying unto God to help him allot his days (time) rightly that he may grow in wisdom on the things he has to do to achieve his goals. Every goal is time-bound. This means that, there is certain period a goal must be achieved to have its desired impact and fulfillment. Goals cannot be set without proper time allocation since this helps to effectively measure the progress in

accomplishing the goal. Allotting time to goals helps one to stay focus and creates some level of urgency in you. Proper time management ensures that you use your time wisely on the things that pertain to your life and destiny. Productive time is time spent on your divine assignment and purpose. You can become diligent when you spend more time on your divine purpose and assignment.

Proverbs 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean men.

- 2. Ensure Proper Planning:** There are basically two extremities on the subject of planning: on one side some Christians think planning is worldly and that it inhibits the free flow of the Holy Spirit whilst on the other side some people over emphasize planning to the extent of excluding the will of the Holy Spirit in their plans. However, there must be a balance of these two extremes. Thus, we should rather subscribe to Spirit guided planning. Planning must begin with what God has said. Planning is the proof of your faith (if you believe what God has said, you will plan on how to achieve it).

Planning is deciding on what our goals are and the best route to reaching them. Scripture indicates that God Himself is a Planner (Isa. 14:24) and He has a plan for His Children (Jer. 29:11). God is still working and we need to partner with His

plans for our lives and destinies (Isa. 43:19). Jesus commented on planning in Luke 14:28-33. Thus, builders and kings going to war were to plan before they engage in order to determine whether they would succeed with what they had. Diligence demands planning far ahead of time on how to achieve your goals.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, I pray that you help me to properly plan my life and destiny in order to remain diligent in every good work in Jesus' name. Amen.*

- 3. Avoid procrastination:** There is a popular saying that “time will tell”. Indeed, with time we will know which people put in much effort into actualizing their dreams. Time is like a womb, what you put into it is what it will give back to you. If one spends all his time sleeping, he will definitely remain poor (“*Proverbs 6:10 Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep: 11 So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth, and thy want as an armed man*”). Time then, is a revealer of the input one is making now. For instance; if one decides to workout, with time everyone will witness the fully built body. Time as a revealer makes man appreciate the law of process that, one step at a time, one can achieve big things at the end. Don’t procrastinate, work now with all your might.

Procrastination will steal your time. Whatever you can do, strive to do it. Develop a **“to do list”** each day and strive to complete all tasks within a given time. This will help you to avoid procrastination and consequently make you diligent.

Ephesians 3:16 That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;

Colossians 1:29 Whereunto I also labour, striving according to his working, which worketh in me mightily.

- 4. Tap into God's might:** In our first anchor scripture, we observe that the spirit of might is part of the seven major manifestations of the Spirit. God's ability resides in us and we are to take advantage of this strength to be diligent in every good work.

In our third anchor scripture, Apostle Paul revealed the source of his strength for the abundant labours he did in Christ. He clearly stated that he was empowered by the might of God at

work in Him. Let us rely on God for strength and might to be diligent.

Concluding the series on diligence, we must be diligent if we want to be successful. When you study the Bible, you would realize that every successful man was very diligent. In fact, God cannot do business with a lazy man. If you want to be used by God, you must be very diligent.

1 Peter 2: 9 But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light”

The word “*ekklesia*” (the church) is used in the New Testament in reference to the believing community and this term basically means “the called-out ones”. This means that no matter the background of an individual, to be in Christ is to be among God’s people. The Church which includes every member of the body of Christ is called to do the work of the ministry. The entire body is called into the ministry of reconciliation (***2 Corinthians 5:18 And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation***).

The Church as a whole has a mandate to impact the whole world with the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and this can simply be described as Mission. Paul R. Stevens in his book “*the other six days: vocation work and ministry in Bible perspective*” highlights that Mission is the intended occupation and preoccupation of the

whole people of God, not merely a few chosen representative or designated missionaries.¹

In conclusion, the mission of the church is for every member of the body of Christ. We are all supposed to reconcile all things unto Christ. Creation awaits the manifestation of the sons of God.

(PART 2)**

Ephesians 4:11 And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; 12 For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:

The Church which includes every member of the body of Christ is called to do the work of the ministry. That is, the “*raison d’etre*” of the Church is ministry. Ministry is for all God’s people. Steven Rundle and Tom A. Steffen suggest that “***as a church, our individual callings and gifts may differ, but mission is however the central purpose of the entire body of Christ***”.²

In other words, the mission of the Church is one but it can be differentiated into various facets. Every member of the body of Christ should be an effective member in fulfilling the mission of the Church. The mission of the Church is primarily the mission

of God which was plainly revealed by the mission of Christ. That is; to save the whole world and bring us to the knowledge of the son of God.

Convincingly, the vision and mission of every local church should reflect the central mission of the Universal Church. Rick Warren in his book, *The Purpose Driven Church*, observes that “**a church without a purpose and mission eventually becomes a museum-piece of yesterday’s traditions**”.³

To conclude, the Church has a serious mandate to fulfil on the earth and God is counting on us for it to be done. Arise unto duty soldier of Christ!

MANDATE SERIES: THE GREAT COMMISSION

Matthew 28: 19 “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world”.

The term ‘Great Commission’ is the “summary label” of Matthew 28:18-20, coined by a Dutch missionary, Justinian von Welz (1621-88), and popularized some 200 years later by Hudson Taylor.⁴ In the concluding part of the book of Matthew, Jesus gave the great commission. The risen Christ appeared to His disciples on a mountain in Galilee and solemnly proclaimed that all authority in heaven and on earth had been given to him. He then charges his followers to make disciples of all nations, instructing them to baptize new converts in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and to teach them to observe all that He has commanded.

These words by Jesus forms the basis of the great commission. It is sad to note that the great commission has become the great omission in some churches. They are doing all other things but neglecting the most vital thing which is the salvation of souls. It is important to add here that, the mission of the Church is broad and involves the reconciliation of all creation but the great commission narrows down to the salvation of men and the maturing of the saints.

In conclusion, in this world of hopelessness, man is at the dire need of hope which can only be restored in Christ. Let us reach out to save souls and mature them in Christ. The great commission should not become the great omission. Let us arise unto duty. The harvest is plenteous!

Matthew 28: 19 “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world”.

The great commission is at the core of the mission of the Church. According to Roy Pointer “the Commission to ‘make disciples’ is a call for church planting, and the basic mandate for church growth”.⁵ Charles R. Swindoll argues that Jesus specified where the mission was to be accomplished, but not how. He knew the world and its cultures would be constantly growing and changing as would the tools available to His followers. Swindoll further argues that without the help of the printing press, radio, Internet, or even a microphone, the disciples turned the world upside down and as such if all believers today take Jesus’ final words as

seriously as the early disciples took them then we can only imagine the results we will get.⁶

Also, in our anchor scripture, the risen Lord sealed the commission with the comforting words that, He is with us always even to the end of the world. We must be able to enter every territory to preach the gospel with boldness because the Lord over the earth is with us.

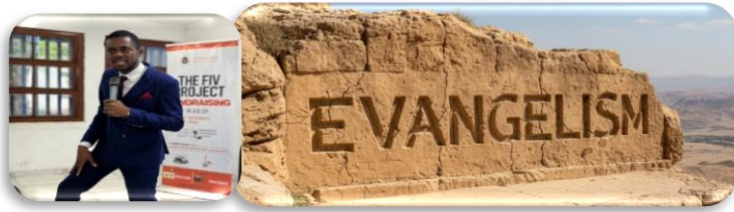
In conclusion, fulfilling the great commission is a mandatory duty of the Church and every member of the body of Christ should be involved.

2 Corinthians 5:18 And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation.

Romans 10:13 For "whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved." 14 How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? 15 And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, Who bring glad tidings of good things!"

In our previous study we learnt about the great commission and its importance. There are two key aspects of the great commission and they are evangelism and discipleship.

Evangelism is simply reaching out to the world with the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. This primarily involves the preaching of the gospel to all people groups on the earth. In our second anchor

scripture we observe about five important things; ***sending, preaching, hearing, believing and saving***. This is the framework of evangelism. Christians must be sent to preach to people for them to hear the good news which they will believe and be saved. In conclusion, if the great commission is for all Christians, then evangelism which is an aspect of the great commission is for all Christians. Let us arise unto duty. The harvest is plenteous!

MANDATE SERIES: DISCIPLESHIP

Matthew 28: 19 “Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world”.

Discipleship is important in raising up mature Christians. Without discipleship, new converts will remain babes in Christ. In 1 Peter 2:2, the apostle admonishes that, new converts be subjected to the Word of God that they will grow thereby. Discipleship is the crucible for teaching new converts the Word of God.

The mandate that Jesus gave us is to make disciples of all nations. We are not just supposed to win souls and leave them like that. Without discipleship, these new converts can be tossed to and fro by every wind of doctrine. Discipleship brings stability to our Christian journey. Teachings ground new converts in the faith.

It is important to understand that discipleship eventually brings in more souls to the kingdom. This is because, a new convert properly discipled

will go out and preach the gospel and win new souls into the kingdom. The new convert again will also be discipled and he or she will also bring in another soul. Thus, the cycle continues. Inevitably, discipleship brings an exponential growth to the Church.

In conclusion, discipleship is the master's strategy for reaching out to the whole world with the gospel with abiding fruits. Souls won through discipleship usually are strong Christians who also bring in new souls.

MANDATE SERIES: THE POWER OF INFLUENCE

John 19:38 And after this Joseph of Arimathaea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, besought Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus: and Pilate gave him leave. He came therefore, and took the body of Jesus. 39 And there came also Nicodemus, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about an hundred pound weight. 40 Then took they the body of Jesus, and wound it in linen clothes with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to bury. 41 Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid. 42 There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation day; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand.

Christ was supposed to be laid in a tomb and resurrect from there. The assignment of Christ would not have been completed if not for some men of influence (*Joseph of Arimathaea and Nicodemus*). These men made sure that Jesus was laid in the tomb.

If the work of salvation needed men of influence, then the preaching of the message of salvation will also need men of influence. There are territories that we cannot take the gospel to if we do not have influence. There are influential people today if they publicly acknowledge the Lordship of Christ, it will cause a serious reaction in the world. Some followers of these people may somewhat be influenced to accept Christ.

CONFESSIOIN: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. I declare that I am influential in my world for the sake of the gospel. I decree that I have access to influential people in Jesus' name. Amen.*

WE HAVE INHERITED AN EXCELLENT NAME

Philippians 2:8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Hebrews 1:4 Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.

A name is not just a way of calling someone, it goes beyond that. A name represents whatever you are. The name Jesus is the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It is the name of the Godhead. A name reveals a personality and/or the office that backs the personality.

In our first anchor scripture, we see how the name of Jesus has been highly exalted above all power and dominion. The bearer of

the name is the Lord over the earth. Jesus is Lord over the whole earth.

The name of Jesus (the Lord over the earth) was his full right and privilege. However, by the death of the cross, He did not just inherit it, He earned the title of the Lordship over the earth. Jesus is Lord both because He is God and He experientially became Lord over the earth when He resurrected from the dead (the firstborn from the dead). To be in Christ, is to be a partaker of whatever He has. Romans 8:17 tells us that we are joint heirs with Christ. Inevitably, we have inherited this excellent name and that is why when we use it, demons, witches, principalities, powers and dominions must bow.

In conclusion, we have received an excellent name and we ought to use it daily in life for limitless victories.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. Father, we thank you for giving us your name. I declare that I have inherited an excellent name and by the name of the Lord I triumph over all principalities and powers in Jesus' name. Amen.*

Acts 3:6 Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk. 7 And he took him by the right hand, and lifted him up: and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength. 8 And he leaping up stood, and walked, and entered with them into the temple, walking, and leaping, and praising God.

for. Thus, whatever we shall call for or require in His name, the Lord will do it. Thus, His power will move to accomplish it. This means that our Lord and master Jesus has given us the power of attorney such that whatever we require in His name it is as though He is the one placing the demand.

Inevitably, Apostle Peter used the name to place a demand on the healing of the man at gate beautiful, and since the name of Jesus is exalted above every power or name, that condition of the man had to give way. Apostle Peter knew they had inherited a name and could use the name to bring healing.

In conclusion, the name of Jesus is our inheritance and we are to use it in our everyday life. It is without any controversy to subscribe to Apostle Paul's instructions: ***“Col 3:17 And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him”.***

In conclusion, arise unto action, and work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. Carry fire today. Get close to people who are on fire for God. Stay more in the secret place to carry the fire of God. Verily verily, I say unto you, Be on fire for God!!!

In conclusion, if we desire lasting rewards from our Father for our charity works, we should not blow our horns for the applause of men but we should give glory to the Lord for enabling us to do these good works.
