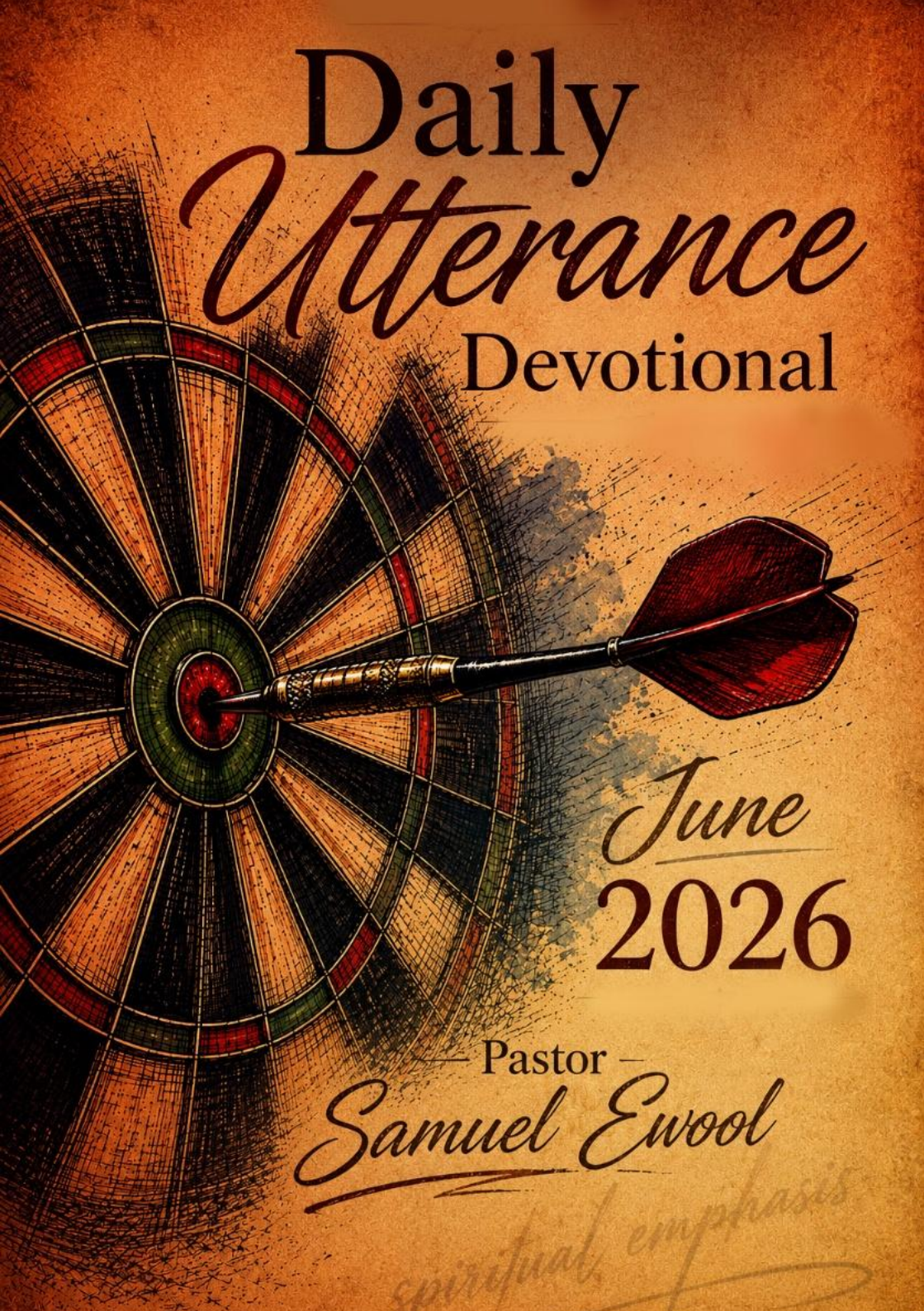

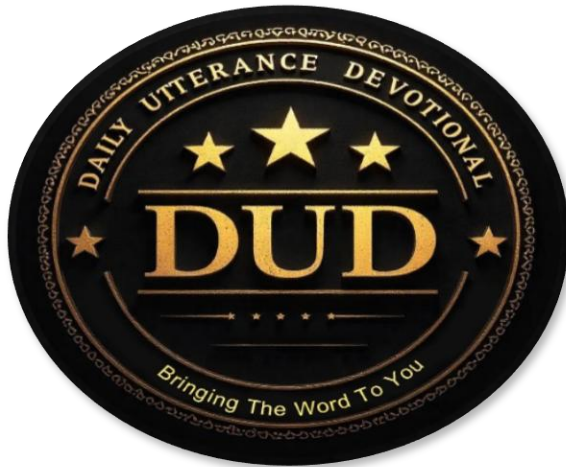

SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS: The Introduction

1 Peter 2:2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:

3 If so be ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious.

4 To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed indeed of men, but chosen of God, and precious,

5 Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.

In our anchor scripture, Apostle Peter admonishes Christians to grow. Spiritual maturity is essential to the Christian. In the verse five he further stated that we are being built to a spiritual house. The spiritual house is Christ and His body (the Church).

It is important to have spiritual emphasis. Thus, you must focus on your spiritual life. The new life you have received is the life of the Spirit. If you do not focus on building your spiritual life, your experience of life in this world will not be different from an unbeliever as Apostle Paul rightly declared in ***Galatians 4:1*** **Now**

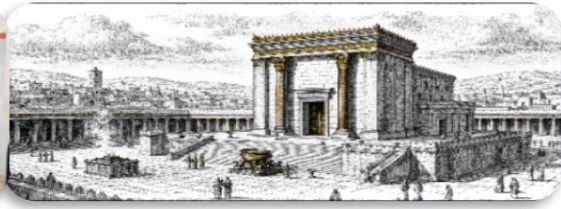
I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all.

ZEAL FOR GOD

***Psalms 69:9 For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up;
and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen
upon me.***

***John 2:17 And his disciples remembered that it
was written, The zeal of thine house hath eaten me.***

As we focus on our spiritual life this month, it is important to begin with our pursuit of God. The pursuit of God is a key for maintaining your spiritual fervency and stamina. In our pursuit of God, we must consider zeal.

Zeal is a strong desire or passion for something. In our second anchor scripture, Apostle John reveals how Jesus was passionate about the house of God. This experience was in reference to ***Psalms 69:9 For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up; and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.***

Jesus had a strong zeal for God and this zeal was transferred to the house of God. In expressing zeal, you must love what God

loves. God loves His house. Although this scripture talks about the physical house of God but this may be applied to the Church. God is passionate about His Church and in our pursuit of God we must be passionate about His Church.

In conclusion, in our pursuit of God, we must be zealous towards Him and what He loves (the Church). Love what God loves.

PRAYER: *Father in the name of Jesus, we thank you for practically stirring us to be zealous in our pursuit. Father, I pray that you help me to stay passionate about God's house in Jesus' name. Amen.*

LONGING FOR THE LORD

Psalms 63:1 O God, thou art my God; early will I seek thee: my soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh longeth for thee in a dry and thirsty land, where no water is;

2 To see thy power and thy glory, so as I have seen thee in the sanctuary.

In our anchor scripture, David longed for God more than water. The psalmist emphasized on the obvious need of water as he was in the wilderness by stating that the land was dry and thirsty and where there was no water. This triple emphasis on the lack of water points to the fact that, the natural thing to desire in this place was water.

However, David did the unconventional and was longing for God. He was desirous to see the power and glory of God. The glory of God is the manifestation of God and His character whilst His

power speaks of His ability. Hence in simple terms, David was longing for all of God and all of His ability.

In our pursuit in life, it is only God that deserves our longing. We should not long for money. The love of money is the root of all evil. We should desire God and He will add all other things to us. Some Christians also desire only the power of God (what God can do) and ignore the glory of God (who God is). This is also not the ideal way to go. You must desire for both the glory and power of God.

In conclusion, seek God early. Long for His heart and His hand. We need all of God (His glory and power).

PRAYER: *Father in the name of Jesus, we thank you for your Word today. We pray for a deep longing for you in our pursuit and fellowship in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 13-15



Thursday

4th June, 2026.

SEEK YE FIRST

Matthew 6:31 Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?

32 (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things.

33 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

In our anchor scripture, Our Lord and master Jesus admonishes us not to be anxious about what we will eat or wear but rather seek first the kingdom of God and its righteousness.

This teaching by our Lord and master Jesus is against the traditional way of living in our world today. Many are on the pursuit of what to eat and wear. Since money is the common legal tender for transactions, people are on the quest for money in order for them to get what to eat or wear.

It is important to note that Jesus did not say that what to eat or wear is not necessary. In fact, He highlighted that the Father knows that we need these things. The focus of Jesus is to re-orient us to channel our strength, energy and pursuit to God first. Thus, when we find God, these things will automatically be added since He knows that we need them.

In conclusion, what to eat or wear or the money needed is not the problem but our desire for them above God is what is the problem. Absolutely nothing in your life should be higher than God. Your desire must be on God who will help you and make sure that you do not lack what to eat or wear or the money to buy these things. The focus of your life must be God first and His kingdom.

PRAYER: *Father in the name of Jesus, we thank you for your Word today. We pray that the anchor scripture for today's teaching will become an anchor for our lives and every member of the Church. Father, may we have the consciousness to daily put you first in Jesus' name. Amen.*

SEEK THE LORD WITH ALL YOUR HEART

Jeremiah 29:13 And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.

Matthew 6:6 But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

In our anchor scripture, prophet Jeremiah admonishes us to seek the Lord with an assurance that He will be found. However, the condition for finding the Lord is to search the Lord with all your heart.

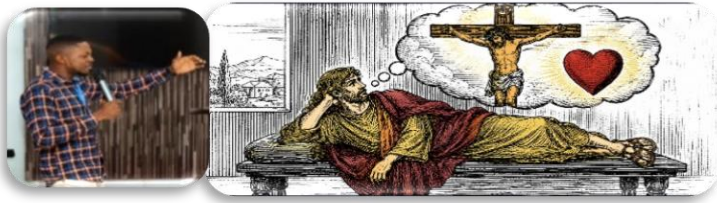
The heart is the innermost part of the Spirit. The heart is the central point of our being. Until your innermost part of your being longs for all of God, you have not started a deep search for the Lord and you may perhaps never find Him.

Our second anchor scripture reveals that God dwells in secret and so you cannot casually go about in seeking Him, you must be intentional and desirous. God is holy and this reveals His uncommonness. God is everywhere but His manifest presence does not carelessly show up everywhere. God dwells in secret and He will manifest where there is deeper longing and pursuit of Him.

In conclusion, all of you must seek for all of God in order to find Him (His manifest presence).

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. Father, I pray that my heart will long for you more than anything else in this world. I pray that my heart will stay on you all the days of my life in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 19-21



Saturday

6th June, 2026.

LOVE THE LORD WITH YOUR ALL

Mark 12:30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. 31 And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these. 32 And the scribe said unto him, Well, Master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he: 33 And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love his neighbour as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.

In our anchor scripture, Jesus emphasized on the love of God. We must love the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. The heart is the innermost part of your being. The soul is the expression of the Spirit. It is the seat of your will and emotions. The mind deals with the intellect. The mind is a tool for interpretation of information. Strength speaks of the might we possess especially in the spirit and body.

Jesus admonishes us to use all of our being in loving God. The spirit, soul, mind and strength (specifically the might in the body) constitutes all of you.

The response of the scribe is fascinating. The scribe said that loving God and thy neighbour is ***more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices***. Inevitably, he argues that our lives should not be necessarily about keeping of spiritual rituals and traditions but our lives should intrinsically be governed by love to God and our neighbour.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. Father, I yield my heart, soul, mind and strength to your love. Father, I pray that I become a complete lover of you in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 22-24



Sunday

7th June, 2026.

PANTING AFTER THE LORD

*Psalms 42:1 As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so
panteth my soul after thee, O God.*

*2 My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall
I come and appear before God?*

In our anchor scripture, the psalmist relates his thirst for God with how the deer pants for water. Usually, the deer may walk miles in search of water and after a while it will begin to pant for water to quench his thirst. In a more serious scenario, the deer is a prey for many predators in the forest and can be chased at any point in time. When it is lucky to escape a hot pursuit by a predator, it will desperately pant for water to quench or cool it down. When the deer finds water, it becomes satisfying to its soul.

The illustration portrayed by the psalmist in our anchor scripture depicts that our panting for God is satisfying to our soul. Inevitably, he uses the description of the **living God** to emphasize on the contact of life when we meet God.

Any time we come before the presence of God we encounter the life of God. We must have a deeper longing for the Holy Spirit who makes the presence of God real to us. The Holy Spirit satisfies our soul with the love of God.

In conclusion, we should earnestly pant for the Lord as we fellowship with the Holy Spirit.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, I pray for a deeper longing for you. Father, may I pant for you all the days of my life in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 25-27



Monday

8th June, 2026.

WE LOVE HIM BECAUSE HE FIRST LOVED US

1 John 4:19 We love him, because he first loved us.

1 John 3:1 Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not.

In our first anchor scripture, Apostle John reveals that our love for God is hinged on God's love for us. You cannot love God if you lack a personal revelation of God's love for you. God is love and He is the source of true love. God has demonstrated His love to us. He first loved us and that is how we can love Him.

In our second anchor scripture, Apostle John shows us how God loved us. John could not comprehend the depth of God's love towards us. The scripture reveals his amazement and awe when he exclaimed that ***“behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us”***.

To become the children of God is God's love at work. God demonstrated His love towards us by giving us His son Jesus that through Him we will become the children of God (heirs of God). This is an amazing love. How could the creator allow His creatures to participate in His life and nature? No wonder if you ponder on God's love for you by appreciating the depth of what He did for us, you will inevitably love Him more.

In conclusion, we love Him because He first loved us. Let us grow in our love for God by pondering on the love of God for us that was demonstrated through the sacrificial death of Christ.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, we thank you for bestowing upon us your name that we should be called your children. Father, as we ponder on your love for us, may we grow in deeper love for you in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 28-29

QUENCH NOT THE SPIRIT

1 Thessalonians 5:19 Quench not the Spirit.

Ephesians 5:18 And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit;

19 Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord;

20 Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;

21 Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God

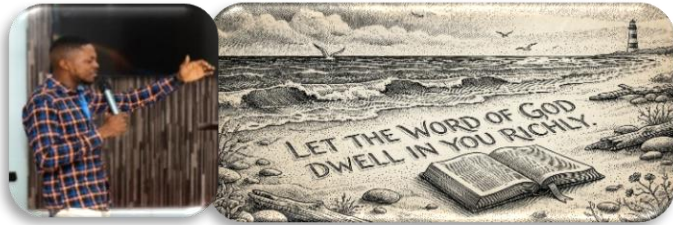
The Holy Spirit is the life of God in a Christian. In our first anchor scripture, apostle Paul admonishes us not to quench the Spirit. The Holy Spirit rekindles the fire of God in us. As we fellowship with the Spirit, we inevitably grant the Holy Spirit a free course in our lives. Thus, in our second anchor scripture, Apostle Paul admonishes us to be filled with the Spirit. This means that we must come to the point when we are under the full control of the

Spirit just like how a wine can intoxicate a man and bring him under subjection.

So, if we are supposed not to quench the Spirit then we must be full of the Spirit and permit Him to control our lives. We should not quench the Spirit by disobeying Him or shutting Him out of our lives. Although the Holy Spirit dwells in us but there are many Christians who do not have active fellowship with the Holy Spirit. They have closed that door. He has been quenched (made passive). Revive your relationship with the Holy Spirit by engaging in active fellowship (***Ephesians 5:19 Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; 20 Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; 21 Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God***).

PRAYER: Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, we pray that we will engage in active fellowship with your Spirit. I declare that I will not quench the Spirit but will let Him have His free course in my life in Jesus' name. Amen.

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 30-32



Wednesday

10th June, 2026.

LET THE WORD OF GOD DWELL IN YOU RICHLY

Col 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

The Word of God is food for our spirit man. The Word of God shapes our understanding and influences how we must live our lives. In our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul admonishes us to let the Word of God dwell in us richly. The Word can really shape and influence our lives if we will permit it to dwell in us. The use of the Word **let** speaks of our allowance. We must allow the Word to have its free course in our lives.

The Word of God is an influencer and as such if we permit the Word in our lives, it will positively influence us to walk in the ways of the Lord. For the Word to dwell richly in us means that we must be full of the Word.

We must be full of the Word in all wisdom. Thus, in all manner of life, we must let the Word of God influence our actions. The proof that the Word of God dwells in you richly is revealed in your speech (***Colossians 4:6 Let your speech be alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man***). Moreover, the mature Christian is perfect in speech (***James 3:2 For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man, and able also to bridle the whole body***).

In conclusion, let the Word of God dwell in you richly as you constantly meditate on the Word.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, grant me grace to meditate on the Word daily. Father, let your Word influence and shape my life and thoughts in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 33-35



Thursday

11th June, 2026.

YOU MUST LEAVE ALL TO FOLLOW HIM

Mark 1:16 Now as he walked by the sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. 17 And Jesus said unto them, Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men. 18 And straightway they forsook their nets, and followed him.

Luke 18:28 Then Peter said, Lo, we have left all, and followed thee. 29 And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the kingdom of God's sake, 30 Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time, and in the world to come life everlasting.

In our first anchor scripture, the Bible reveals the call of Peter. The background to his call was that he obeyed the Lord's word and caught many fishes to the full capacity of his fishing net. However, he left all and followed Jesus. If you want to fully follow Jesus, there is always something you must leave behind. You must totally yield and surrender to Him. That is why total

surrender is the ultimate key for being a disciple (servant) of Jesus Christ.

Later in the ministry of Jesus, Peter rehearsed the price of his call to Jesus. The response of Jesus was refreshing. He did not rebuke him but gave him an all-encompassing assurance of great rewards not only in this life but even in the eternities.

In conclusion, whatever you sacrifice for Jesus, you have not really lost, you are just multiplying it to receive it back in manifolds. God is a good God. He is not unrighteous to forget your sacrifices and labours.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, I pray that you grant me the power to lay down anything that will hinder me from following you in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 36-38



Friday

12th June, 2026.

PRAYER AND FASTING

Matthew 6:6 But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. 7 But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking.

Matthew 6:16 Moreover when ye fast, be not, as the hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.

Matthew 17:21 Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting.

In our first and second anchor scripture, our Lord and master Jesus used the word **when**. When speaks of a compulsory scheduled event or moment. Thus, prayer and fasting are compulsory scheduled event of one's life. You cannot choose one and leave the other. The two must go hand in hand.

As a Christian you must pray and fast. Our third anchor scripture highlights that ***this kind goeth not except by prayer and fasting.*** Some Bible scholars argue that what leaves by fasting and prayer is the unbelief that Jesus initially talked about in the passage. On the other hand, other Bible scholars argues for the departure of the demonic spirits. For me, whether the former or the latter, prayer and fasting takes away something negative and causes the power and glory of God to manifest.

Consequently, a Christian must pray and fast often to the end that the power and glory of God will be manifested in his or her life.

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, we pray that you stir us up unto prayer and fasting to the end that your power and glory will be manifested in our lives and destiny in Jesus' name.*
Amen.

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Exodus 39-40



Saturday

13th June, 2026.

THIS IS NOT YOUR REST

Micah 2:10 Arise ye, and depart; for this is not your rest: because it is polluted, it shall destroy you, even with a sore destruction.

In our anchor scripture, the Bible reveals the dangers of plateauing at the same level in life when that is not the end of your destiny. The instruction from this scripture is to arise and depart. In the kingdom, we arise by the coming of light (***Isa 60:1 Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee***). It takes the light of God to see that where you are is not your rest and that there is a higher level of glory awaiting you.

You must strive to leave this current level of life. You must change levels in spirituality, prayer, word study, fasting, godly character, finances, power, marital life, among others. Depart from your lower level of glory. Our anchor scripture reveals the danger of staying at the same level whereas that is not your end. It clearly states that it will destroy you, even with a sore destruction. When there is no growth and switch in levels of

glory, you will exhaust all the possibilities of that dimension to the end that things may remain the same. Stagnant waters smell bad. Stagnation in life will make your life sting. You must continue to move from glory to glory. Hallelujah!!

PRAYER: *Father we thank you for your Word today. Father, I pray that you stir in me a desire and passion to move from glory to glory. Father, may I not plateau at the same level in Jesus' name. Amen.*

1 YEAR BIBLE READING PLAN: Leviticus 1-4



Sunday

14th June, 2026.

THE SACRIFICE OF PRAISE

1 Peter 2:9 But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light

Hebrews 13:15 By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name.

In our first anchor scripture, Apostle Peter revealed that we are kings and priest. Every priest of God in the Old Testament offered sacrifices unto God. Inevitably, as the priests of God in the New Testament we are also expected to offer sacrifices unto God.

In our second anchor scripture, the writer of Hebrews shows us the sacrifice we are supposed to bring to God. Thus, whereas the priests in the Old Testament offered animals (cattle, sheep, goat, dove, etc.), the priests of God in the New Testament (the Church) are to offer sacrifices of praise. He further highlighted that this

sacrifice of praise is the fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name.

The reason why it is a sacrifice is that, no matter the situation a Christian goes through we are supposed to give thanks unto the Lord. When we praise God in good situations, it is still a sacrifice of praise. Nevertheless, if we are able to praise God even in our trying moments, then our sacrifice of praise is more beautiful.

In conclusion, the sacrifice of praise is simply the fruit of our lips (our words) giving thanks and acknowledgement to God.

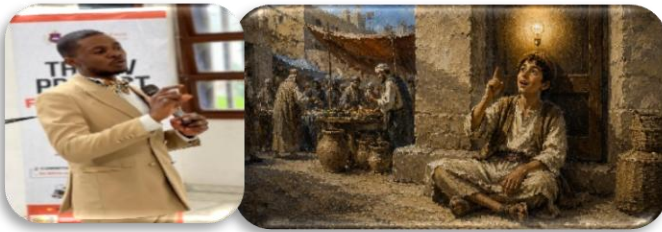

THE POWER OF IMAGINATION

Proverbs 23:7 For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he: Eat and drink, saith he to thee; but his heart is not with thee.

Genesis 11:4 And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth. 5 And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded. 6 And the LORD said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

In our first anchor scripture, we observe that as a man thinks so is he. This means that your thought pattern reveals who you are and not who you will be. One of the major influencers of our thoughts is our imaginations. Imaginations are picturesque forms of intents, words, ideas, concepts, predictions, etc. that comes to us or are conceived by our own mind.

What I mean here is that, imaginations can come to us from the Holy Spirit in us, from angels ministering to us, or even Satan and his demons. That is why it important to judge every imagination by the Word of God to discern its source. Imaginations from Satan and his demons are to be cast down (**2 Corinthians 10:5** ***Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ).***

In our second anchor scripture, we observe that the people imagined to build a tower to make a name for themselves but that vision was not of God so He had to come down and confuse their language. Imaginations that are not of God should not be entertained. Never feel or think that imaginations do not have power to influence you. The things you imagine influence your thought patterns which are a reflection of the true you.

In conclusion, keep your imaginations clean and anchored on the Word of God. Immediately cast down or reject any imagination contrary to the Word of God. Do not underestimate its potential in your life.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. I pull down all imaginations and thoughts that are contrary to the Word of God in my life in Jesus' name. Amen.*

People usually say talk is cheap but, in the kingdom, you must realize that what you say is what you get. In our first anchor scripture, we observe that God spoke and He saw the things He spoke about. You must be bold in your confessions. The reason why what we say is what we will see is because we were created in the image and likeness of God, such that even in the fall of humanity that power is still at work. Thus, death and life are in the power of the tongue.

It is intriguing to highlight here that if the fallen man speaks consistently about something and it manifests (although the efficiency may be low because of the fall), how much more the Christian who is filled with the Holy Ghost. Brethren, your words carry power. Learn to use it rightly. Speak and you shall see it manifest.

Confession simply is speaking what God has said. If God said it and He saw it, then, if you speak you shall also see because you carry His very life and nature in Christ. This reality is far greater than the possibility of the first man Adam.

In conclusion, speak rightly about the situations of life and it shall be fulfilled in Jesus' name. Hallelujah!!

In our first anchor scripture, Apostle Paul gives us the assurance of receiving all things from God. Based on this assurance, you must have the boldness to ask your Father in faith whatever you need. The problem is that many people give up in asking if they do not get their answers the first day they ask. You must continue to ask until you receive an answer. Jesus talked about the

importunity of the woman that wanted the judge to avenge her adversaries and related it to how men ought to pray always.

Our Father is a good God and in our second anchor scripture, He gives us the assurance that ***every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.*** The fact that you are asking and God has not answered does not mean He will not answer. No matter how much a father loves his son in the natural, he will not give his one-year-old son a car to drive just because he asked for it but he will wait until he matures so he gives to him. Similarly, sometimes the reason why we do not receive the answers for our request is that we have not built the spiritual capacity or maturity to handle the answer and as such God will have to wait and help you to mature before He gives it to you. He loves you so much to the extent that He will not give you what you cannot handle. His gifts are to be enjoyed and not to destroy us.

In conclusion, continue to ask the Lord in faith. If He spared not His son, He shall with Him freely give us all things. However, constantly check if you have the spiritual capacity and maturity to handle the answer to your request.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. I pray that you will help me to build the spiritual capacity needed to receive answers to my requests in Jesus' name. Amen*

Your prosperity is in your mouth. Our mouth was not given to us just for eating but for our prosperity. In our anchor scripture, we observe that a man's belly shall be satisfied with the fruit of his mouth. The satisfaction of the belly figuratively speaks of prosperity. You shall be filled with the fruit of your lips. This simply means that you must confess your prosperity in Christ and you shall have it.

In our attempt to emphasize on the power of actions, people downplay the efficacy of words. But your words have the power to make or unmake you. Sometimes, you may hear people tagging some pastors as prosperity preachers and giving them a funny

connotation of not being credible. But if we do not preach (speak) about our prosperity in Christ then perhaps we have to preach (speak) about our poverty and depravity in the fallen man. Do not adhere to those perspectives. We must actually speak or preach of our prosperity in Christ. It is better to be a prosperity preacher than a poverty preacher.

In conclusion, use your mouth rightly to speak about your prosperity in Christ. What you say is what you will get.

***19 So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was
received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God.***

In our anchor scripture, our Lord and master Jesus spoke about the signs that must follow those who will believe the gospel. The gospel of Christ is ***the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek (Romans 1:16)***. When you believe the gospel and receive Christ Jesus you

4 He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church.

Our mouth is given to us for speaking divine realities. When the Spirit came upon the disciples in the upper room, they were given utterance by the Holy Spirit to speak with new tongues. Tongues is the language of the spirit (new man in Christ).

When a child is born into the world, it is born into a language and we expect it to speak the human language. Similarly, when you are born again in Christ, you are also supposed to speak the heavenly language. Tongues is our heavenly language.

In our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul declares that he that speaks in tongues speaks mysteries and edifies himself. It is expedient therefore to speak in tongues often. You can speak in tongues anywhere and anytime if you want to. So long as you can use your mouth, you can speak in tongues. Tongues speaking is for your advantage. Speak in tongues often to benefit from edification, the speaking of mysteries, direct communication to God, charging of your spirit, among others.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. We thank you for teaching us the need to speak in tongues often. Father, stir me up each day to speak in tongues as much as I can in Jesus' name. Amen.*

People give too many excuses for their prayerlessness. However, our anchor scripture reveals that when we are desperate for answers, all excuses will fade away. Your desperation will kill all your excuses. We must continue to ask, seek and knock until there is an answer from the Lord.

It is important to note that, it seems that God will not do anything in your life unless there is prayer. Either you pray by yourself or someone prays for you. There must surely be a prayer. Prayer is our partnership and agreement to the will of God. Spirits are not allowed to interfere in the affairs of men without their partnership or agreement. Whether someone agrees on your behalf or you agree by yourself, there must be a partnership and agreement with a man. God is a Spirit and He has yielded Himself to his own law. Consequently, for God to directly interfere in your personal life, there must be an agreement and partnership with a man on earth (either yourself or your representative).

So, it is time to pray and stop complaining. Become desperate and tired of your current situation and pray your way into new levels of glory. Pray until something happens.

Thus, his emphasis was on governmental leaders like kings, presidents, prime ministers, cabinet ministers, parliamentarians, etc. Praying for these people is important because of the following reasons;

1. When we pray for governmental leaders, it leads to a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. The peace a country enjoys is highly influenced by the actions and inactions of governmental leaders.
2. Praying for governmental leaders is good and acceptable in the sight of God: Anything that God commends is worth our attention.
3. God desires that all men (including governmental leaders) be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. The more Christ-like governmental leaders we have the better it is for the people.

In conclusion, although you are Christian but you must be a responsible citizen of your country by praying for your governmental leaders. Inevitably, you will be making significant impact both in the spirit and the natural (as you go about your responsibilities as a citizen).

1 Corinthians 4:18 Now some are puffed up, as though I would not come to you. 19 But I will come to you shortly, if the Lord will, and will know, not the speech of them which are puffed up, but the power. 20 For the kingdom of God is not in word, but in power.

Matthew 12:22 Then was brought unto him one possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb: and he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw. 23 And all the people were amazed, and said, Is not this the son of David? 24 But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils. 25 And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand: 26 And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand? 27 And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your children cast them out? therefore they shall be your judges. 28 But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you.

In our first anchor scripture, we observe that Apostle Paul highlights that the kingdom of God is in power. In other words, the kingdom of God is expressed through power and not just words. There must be a demonstration of the power of God when we desire the manifestation of the kingdom.

In our second anchor scripture, the critics of Jesus questioned His authority and genuineness. Jesus emphatically rehearsed to them that if He cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come. The kingdom of God in this context is the manifestation of the Spirit and power of God. Thus, the expression of divine life in a place or a being.

The demonstration of the power of God is the revealing of the kingdom of God. Without power demonstration, there is no kingdom expression. There must be power in the Church. Let the power of God flow and bring deliverance, healing, salvation, breakthroughs, favour, impartations, activations, among others. As the Spirit of God moves in power, the kingdom is expressed relentlessly.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. We thank you for teaching us on the power of God. I pray and yield myself as a vessel of God's power. Father, use me to demonstrate your power and bring healing, salvation, prosperity and deliverance to others in Jesus' name. Amen*

WILLINGNESS IN THE DAYS OF HIS POWER

Psalms 110:3 Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth.

Acts 4: 31 And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness. 32 And the multitude of them that believed were of one heart and of one soul: neither said any of them that ought of the things which he possessed was his own; but they had all things common. 33 And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all. 34

Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, 35 And laid them down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need.

In our first anchor scripture, the psalmist connected the willingness of God's people to the manifestation of God's power. Thus, one of the diagnoses for unwillingness in the body of Christ is a lack of power.

In our second anchor scripture, we see a practical demonstration of this principle. When there was a great manifestation of the power of God with miracles, signs and wonders, the people were willing to serve the Lord. Their hearts were touched by the Lord to the extent that they gave up all that they had to the kingdom of God. Lands and houses were sold and given to the Church to the end that no one would lack. This willingness to love one another as the Lord commanded them came about because of the demonstration of power.

It is worthy to note that, no matter how hardened one's heart becomes, a demonstration of the power of God can soften that heart even if the person is like Pharaoh. Pharaoh became willing to give in to the Word of God (let my people God) only after he saw the demonstration of the power of God to its peak.

In conclusion, the Church should walk in power if it desires its members to be willing in all things to the glory of God. Power makes people willing.

FAITH IN THE POWER OF GOD

1 Corinthians 2:2 For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified.3 And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling. 4 And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: 5 That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.

In our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul reveals that the demonstration of the Spirit and power of God works on our faith. It is easier to believe God in a place where there are many miracles, signs and wonders than in a place where there are few manifestations of the power of God. The demonstration of the Spirit and power in a place is the crucible for breeding faith in God.

Apostle Paul's concern was that, as he preached the word of God intellectually, people will not just put their confidence in the persuasive power of his speeches but their faith should be centred

on the power of God. There are preachers who concentrate too much on oratory and use men's wisdom to entice people to believe in the gospel but Paul's focus was on the power in the simplicity of the gospel. It is not the enticing words of man's wisdom that is needed for faith but the demonstration of the Spirit and power of God.

It is important to note that, Paul was not trying to downplay the wisdom aspect in the preaching of the gospel. Earlier in the previous chapter he said that ***“unto them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God”***. In addition, he later stated ***“Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought:7 But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory”*** (1 Corinthians 2:6).

So, Paul's concern was the use of enticing words of man's wisdom without the demonstration of the Spirit and power of God. We must rather speak the wisdom of God and demonstrate the Spirit and power of God to the end that the faith of the people will be in God and not in the wisdom of men.

PRAYER: *Father, we thank you for your Word today. We thank you for teaching us on faith in the power of God. I pray that I will not rely on enticing words of man's wisdom but my faith will hinge on the power of God. I declare that I walk in the demonstration of the Spirit*

and power of God and my faith is resolute in God's ability in Jesus' name. Amen.
