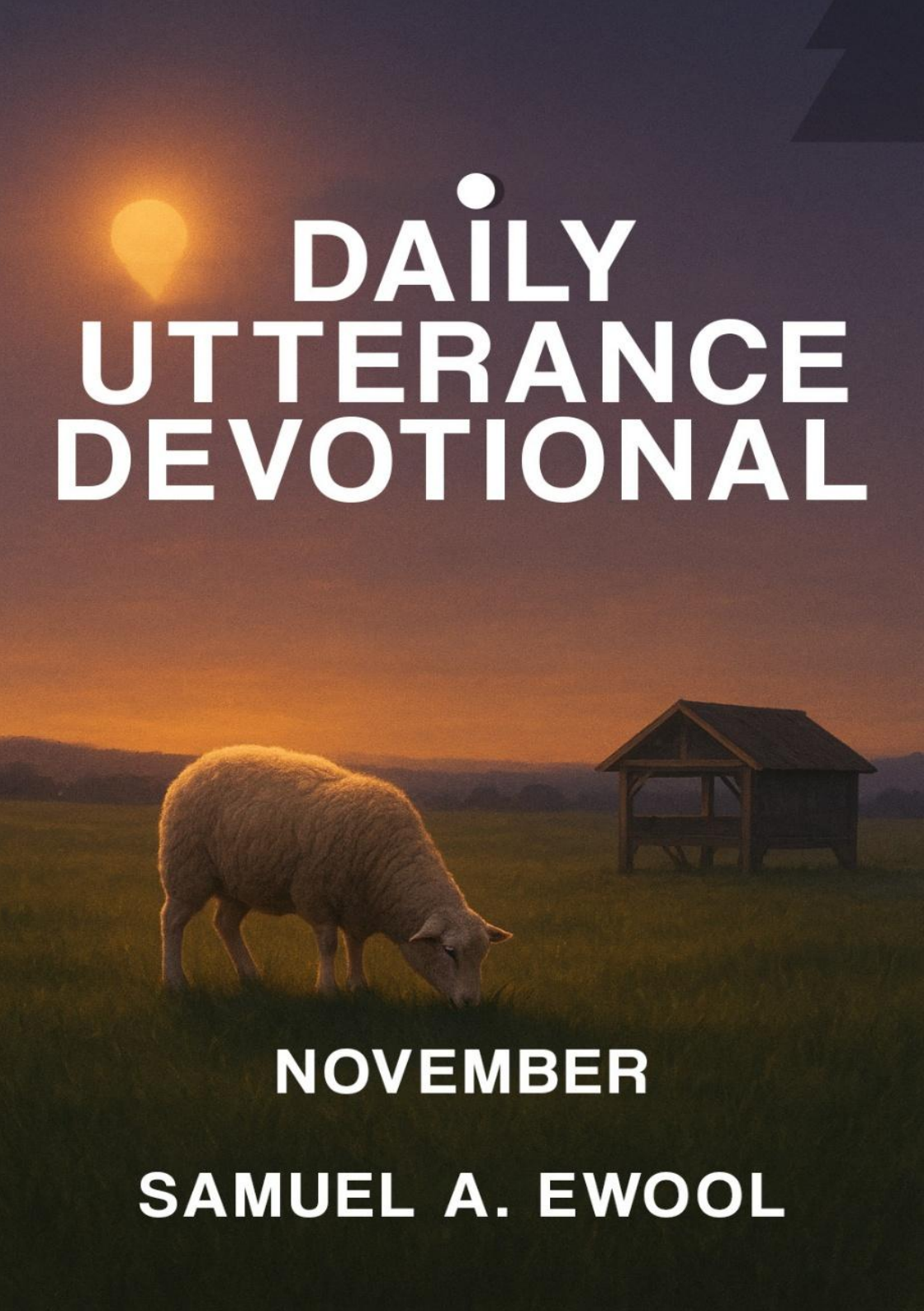

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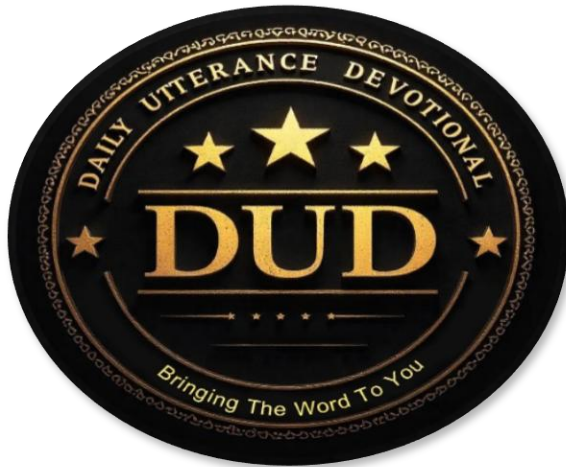
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Introduction

THE PRACTICE OF FAITH: WE LIVE BY FAITH AND NOT BY SIGHT

Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the substance (the sub strata, the foundation, the grounds) of things hoped for, the evidence (title deed) of things not seen.

In our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul begins with the basic definition of faith and as such we can know what faith is and what faith is not. Convincingly, we can say that faith is not about seeing and believing. It is not based on the senses. It does not say unless I see with my eyes and feel with my hands I will not believe.

As Christians we have all been born again with a measure of faith and it is our responsibility to grow our faith and live by it (***Romans 12:3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith).***

We must grow our faith by feeding on the Word of God. Learn to hear and read the Word of God every day because faith comes by hearing and not what you have heard. Stay with the Word of God each day. Our ears are always hanging there listening to whatever is spoken whether you are conscious of it or not. It is our sole responsibility to determine what our ear hears. If you are not growing in faith, change what your ear hears. It is worthy to note that we do not only hear by our physical ears but it is the basic way to hear things on the earth.

In conclusion, we are supposed to live by faith always and as such we must consciously grow our faith each day to live by faith.

THE ROAD MAP OF FAITH

Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the substance (the sub strata, the foundation, the grounds) of things hoped for, the evidence (title deed) of things not seen.

Intrinsically, faith is a journey or a process when properly followed will yield the expected results. A basic road map of faith is considered in today's study.

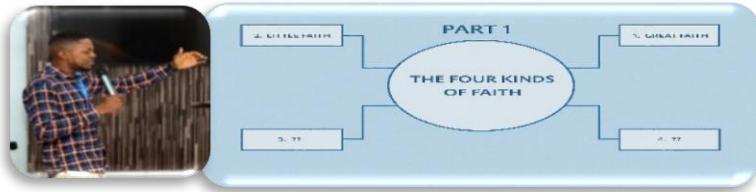
1. The Encounter with the Word: the journey of faith begins with an encounter with the Word of God (***Romans 10:17 So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God***).
2. Meditation of the Word: You are supposed to meditate on the Word of God till you know your role to play in the fulfillment of the Word (***Joshua 1:8 This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.***

3. Actions of Obedience: These are the things you do because you have believed the Word of God. They are the patterns you must follow for the Word of God to be fulfilled in your life (*James 2:17 Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. 18 Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works. 20 But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?*). Consequently, you must align with what the Word of God is saying and faithfully do your part.

In conclusion, the road map of faith is a journey. You must make sure you have received the Word of God, believed that Word, discover the part you must play and faithfully do your part. The manifestation of the Word of God will surely follow. Grow your faith and constantly adhere to the road map of faith.

THE FOUR KINDS OF FAITH (PART ONE): LITTLE AND GREAT FAITH

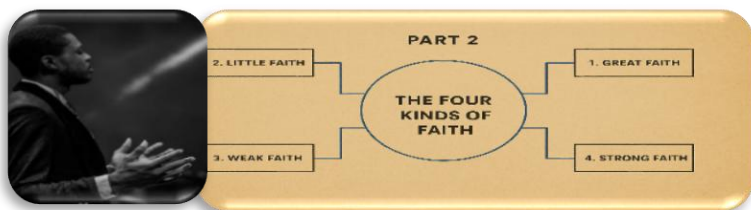
Based on the growth and the strength of our faith, we can categorize faith into four different kinds.

1. **Little Faith:** *Matt 14:26-30 Peter walks on water but when the wind started blowing he became afraid. Mt 14:31 And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?* Little faith can get you started but might not get the work done. When storms of life hit, you can be terrorized by fear. Doubt and fear can creep in when you have little faith and these two cannot accomplish the task. Little faith is as a result of little information. The cure for little faith then is to go for more knowledge in the Word of God.
2. **Great Faith:** *Matthew 15:22 And, behold, a woman of Canaan came out of the same coasts, and cried unto him,*

saying, Have mercy on me, O Lord, thou Son of David; my daughter is grievously vexed with a devil. 23 But he answered her not a word. And his disciples came and besought him, saying, Send her away; for she crieth after us. 24 But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 25 Then came she and worshipped him, saying, Lord, help me 26 But he answered and said, It is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast it to dogs. 27 And she said, Truth, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table. 28 Then Jesus answered and said unto her, O woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt. And her daughter was made whole from that very hour. Great faith does not give up when faced with opposition. Great faith is based on the amount and quality of information (the Word of God) you have received, accepted and endorsed.

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. I thank you for opening my eyes to these two kinds of faith. I declare that my faith is becoming great in Jesus' name. Amen.*

THE FOUR KINDS OF FAITH (PART TWO): WEAK AND STRONG FAITH

3. **Weak Faith:** *Romans 4:19 And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb.* Weak faith is as a result of not exercising your faith. That is: when you hear the Word of God and you don't act on it, your faith will become weak. Weak faith asks for proof before it can believe God's word. It wavers and staggers. Mostly, weak faith will say the Bible says this but let us be realistic. But you must understand that the Word of God is truth and that is the actual reality. You can cure weak faith by doing the Word. For instance: *1Th 5:18 In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.* So, start thanking God in every situation.

4. **Strong Faith: Romans 4:18** *Who against hope believed in hope, that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be. 19 And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb: 20 He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God.* Strong faith gives glory to God even when it has not seen the physical manifestation of the promise (Word of God) because it knows that it will surely manifest. Strong faith is quick to believe the Word of God and act on it. Strong faith has absolute confidence and reliance on the Word of God. It believes in the potency of the Word. It does not consider the current circumstances but focuses on what God is saying.

In conclusion, let us grow our faith to great and strong faith and we will constantly live a victorious life.

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. I pray that, you will stir in my heart a stronger love for your Word to grow my faith. I declare that I walk in great and strong faith in Jesus' name. Amen.*

THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT LOVING THE LORD

1 Corinthians 16:22 If anyone does not love the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be accursed. O Lord, come! (NKJV)

In Deuteronomy 10:12, God emphatically states that love is something He requires from His people. God requires love from us. God must be our focus of love. We must love Him with all our heart, mind, soul, strength, body, etc. In fact, we must love Him with ***all that we are*** and ***all that we have***. God seeks for our love. We must not deny Him of this special request.

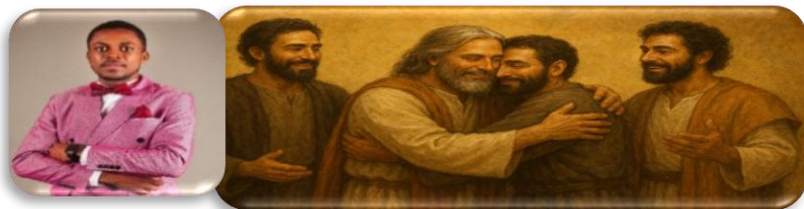
However, any requirement from God that is not met has dire consequences. For instance; in our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul describes what must be done to anyone among the flock of God who does not love God. The judgement “to be accursed” basically means to be excommunicated which describes the official exclusion of someone from the membership of a church. It also means to disfellowship or banish. Inevitably, Apostle Paul’s strict

judgment presupposes that to be among the flock of God, it is a mandatory command to love the Lord.

In conclusion, let us be lovers of God. We can truly demonstrate our love to God if we have a personal revelation of His love for us. Some believers do not love God with passion because they do not know God's passionate love for them. If you think about His love for you, it is impossible not to love him passionately.

**Monday****6th November, 2025.****JOHN'S TEACHINGS ON LOVE**

Apostle John provides practical teachings on love. His teachings are direct practical ways of walking in love and as such one needs to frequently meditate on them in order to manifest the love of God to others. The scriptures for meditation in today's study are as follows.

1 John 2:9-11 He that saith he is in the light, and hateth his brother, is in darkness even until now. 10 He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him. 11 But he that hateth his brother is in darkness, and walketh in darkness, and knoweth not whither he goeth, because that darkness hath blinded his eyes.

1 John 3:14-19, We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother

abideth in death. 15 Whosoever hateth his brother is a murderer: and ye know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in him. 16 Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. 17 But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him? 18 My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth. 19 And hereby we know that we are of the truth, and shall assure our hearts before him.

1 John 4:7-13 Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. 8 He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. 9 In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. 10 Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 11 Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another. 12 No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us. 13

Hereby know we that we dwell in him, and he in us, because he hath given us of his Spirit.

In conclusion, spend some quality time to carefully read, meditate and apply them to your life.

THE BELIEVER'S AUTHORITY

***Matthew 28:18 And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying,
All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth.
(NKJV)***

***Galatians 4:1 Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a
child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord
of all; 2 But is under tutors and governors until the time
appointed of the father.***

In our first anchor scripture, our Lord and master Jesus declared that all authority has been given to Him. As we are one with Christ, we share in this authority positionally. We are in high rank seated with Christ far above all authority and power. As Christians we must know who we are in Christ.

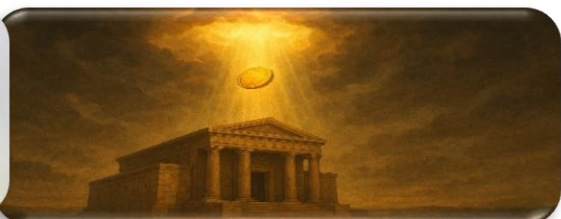
However, it is important to note that this authority can be fully utilized in our daily lives if we grow in Christ. In our second anchor scripture, Apostle Paul reveals that the son of a king is born into authority over all the land of his father but until he

matures, he cannot exert that authority. Similarly, we have all authority and power in Christ but until we mature, we may not be able to exert this authority in our everyday life.

In conclusion, do not permit the devil to have a field day in your life, you have authority in Christ. It is time to take up responsibility as children of God to check the devil and his cohorts back to hell.

FINANCIAL RESOURCES MUST BE USED FOR KINGDOM ADVANCEMENT

Zechariah 1:17 Cry yet, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; My cities through prosperity shall yet be spread abroad; and the LORD shall yet comfort Zion, and shall yet choose Jerusalem.

Our anchor scripture reveals a deep truth on how financial resources can be used to advance the kingdom of God. We must be convinced on how prosperity is necessary for kingdom advancement and as such today's study provides us with examples to solidify our convictions.

- 1. Solomon's Temple:** The gold, silver, minerals, precious stones, labour force, etc. they used to build it will amount to about half a billion dollars in present day. If you care to know; assuming you spend \$10,000 every day, it will take you about 274 years to exhaust 1 billion dollars. It takes financial resources to build beautiful edifices for the kingdom of God.
- 2. The use of financial resources in Jesus' ministry:** Our master Jesus had 12 disciples who were depending on Him for their daily bread (Remember they *left all* to follow Jesus and this included their jobs). Jesus travelled by ship and

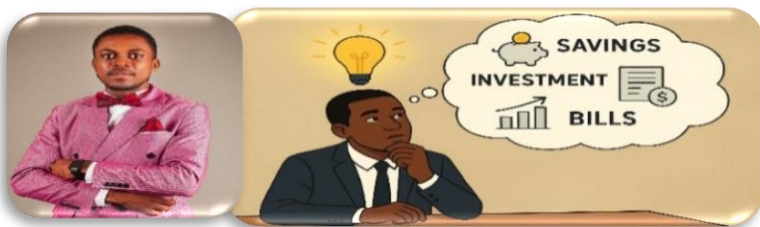
transportation through this means is costly. Again, Jesus had enough financial resources in the treasury that Judas Iscariot could even steal from it. Considering all these financial possibilities Jesus had in His ministry, Paul said in **2 Cor 8:9** *For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.* One can only imagine the richness we are supposed to walk in if the Lord has made us rich in Christ.

3. **The use of financial resources in the early Church:** (**Acts 4:34-37:** *Neither was there any among them that lacked: for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, And laid them down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need*). Again, Paul travelled by ships (the most expensive means of transport at the time). So, the early Church had money for kingdom business.
4. **The use of financial resources in the Church today:** Jesus said we should go to all nations to preach the gospel. One must note that the gospel is free but the means to get the gospel to another country is not free. You cannot walk on foot to China to go and preach the Word. There is a lot the Church will not achieve if we do not have the required financial capacity. If you care to know, you can find out the cost of organizing one crusade. As Archbishop Benson Idahosa once said “the next important thing for ministry after the anointing is money”.

In conclusion, there is a lot the Church can do when it is financially sound.

In our anchor scripture, we are admonished to write down our vision and run with it. When it comes to the area of finance some Christians live it to chance without adequately writing down a vision. If indeed you are kingdom minded, you should have a vision on the financial contributions you desire to invest into the kingdom each year. This vision must be inspired by your love for God and the desire to see His kingdom expand.

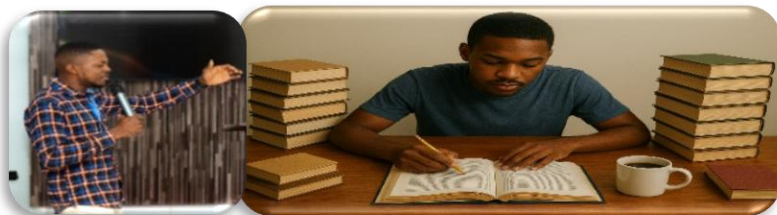

In our anchor scripture, the Bible reveals one cause of a destructive life which is a lack of knowledge. Our kingdom is knowledge dependent. What you know informs what you do which determines the results you obtain in life. Have a vision to build your intellectual capacity and this may include, knowledge on your Christian journey, knowledge in the field of your divine assignment, knowledge on marriage to have a blissful marital life (if you will marry), etc.

You must have a vision for the number of books you want to read each year. Set a target each month or week and have a vision of becoming a continuous voracious reader and learner. Every leader is a reader. Leaders do not graduate from the school of learning.

In conclusion, build your intellectual capacity daily. There is nothing wrong with having too much knowledge but everything is wrong with having inadequate or no knowledge.

Proverbs 18:24 A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother.

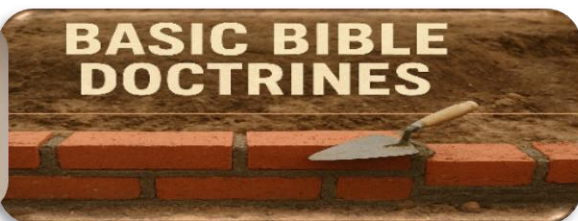

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: AN INTRODUCTION

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Doctrines are systematic beliefs of a particular religious group. Hence, Christian doctrines are systematic beliefs of the Christian faith. A single text in the Bible cannot be used as a doctrine but a systematic consideration of the subject matter from Genesis to Revelation in order to investigate what the entire Bible says about that subject can be the basis of forming a doctrine. This means that doctrines should have strong theological basis but not a mere personal Christian experience.

The use of personal spiritual experiences as doctrines has caused a lot of deviations in the body of Christ. A sound Christian doctrine considers what both the Old Testament and the New

Testament have to say about the subject. A Christian doctrine then is universal and applicable for all Christians.

On another note, there may be church doctrines which are limited to a particular denomination and applicable to all its members. Church doctrines sometimes are the basis for the culture and traditions practiced within a particular denomination. Church doctrines make a denomination different from one another but Christian doctrines unify all denominations together as one body of Christ. Christian doctrines make the Christian firm and stable in the faith.

In conclusion, Christian doctrines are clearly spelt out in the Bible and since the Bible is the sacred text for all Christians, the doctrines in them are binding for all.

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: REPENTANCE FROM DEAD WORKS (PART ONE).

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Primarily, repentance from dead works occurs in two folds. The first scenario is the dead (unbeliever) performing works. Thus, the works performed by someone who is not born again is considered as **“dead works”**. This is because anyone who is not born again is dead in trespasses and sins (***Ephesians 2:1-And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins***). You must understand that it is not about whether what the person did was right or wrong but who he or she is. Dead people automatically do dead works. Repentance from dead works for such a person means changing his or her mind to follow Jesus so

that he or she will be quickened together in Christ away from being dead in trespasses and sins.

Remember that repentance is from the Greek work **metanoia** which is derived from two Greek words; **meta (change)** and **nous (mind or understanding)**. So, **metanoia** means to change your mind. The Bible uses repentance to describe the change of mind that affects our entire life.

Consequently, for the unbeliever to be able to work good works he or she must be born again. The basic pattern for a sinner's prayer must include;

1. An acknowledgement that he or she is a sinner who cannot save him/herself.
2. A confession of his/her sins and the plea for forgiveness.
3. A believe in Jesus and a confession that He is the son of God who died for our sins and rose on the third day.
4. A reception of the life of God through the declaration of receiving the life and nature of God.
5. A final declaration that he or she is born again.

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. I thank you for the opportunity offered through Christ for all souls to be saved from death and come into life. Father, make me a soul winner today so that people will work good works and not dead works in Jesus' name. Amen.*

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: REPENTANCE FROM DEAD WORKS (PART TWO).

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

In our previous study we looked at the first scenario of repentance from dead works. In today's study we will consider the second scenario. This one occurs when Christians perform dead works. In the simplest definition, these are works done by wrong motives, works done outside the will of God and works done in the flesh. In other words, any work the Christian does that is not of his kind is a dead work.

We are ordained unto good works (***Ephesians 2:10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.***). Good works are works done according to the will of God, works

done with genuine motives (for the sake of Christ) and works done in the Spirit. It is important therefore for Christians to renew our minds and work according to the will of God (***Romans 12: 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God***).

Dead works by a Christian will lead to loss at the end of time (the beamer seat judgement of Christ which is exclusively for believers). This is where our works will be tried (***1 Corinthians 3:11 For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ. 12 Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; 13 Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. 14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. 15 If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire***). The fire in the scripture below will be the fire in the eyes of Jesus that will scan our works to see which ones will pass the test. Works based on the flesh, wrong motives (men pleasing, to prove a point other than Christ, competitive spirit motives, etc), among others will be rejected (no reward).

Also, our works should be motivated by our love for God first then our love for man to stand the test of fire in the eyes of Jesus. Again, our works should be based on the three abiding virtues (***1***

Corinthians 13:13 And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love).

In conclusion, we must continuously renew our minds after the Word of God so that we will be able to work good works.

- 1. Faith In the Existence of God:** *Hebrews 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.* God is the uncaused cause that causeth all things. When you consider the order in the galaxies and human anatomy, there must definitely be a master mind behind these. This can only be God. We must fully belief in the existence of God.

2. **Faith In Who God Is:** *Exodus 3:13 And Moses said unto God, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them? 14 And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you.* God is the Creator (*Gen 1:1 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth*). He is the King of kings (*Isaiah 66:1 Thus saith the LORD, The heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool: where is the house that ye build unto me? and where is the place of my rest?*). God will not be stronger tomorrow than He is today. He is the all-powerful God.

In conclusion, we must have faith in the existence of God and who He is. He that comes to God must believe that He is.

You must believe in God's ability (Matthew 19:26 But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible).

4. **Faith in who He says we are: *Hebrews 10:38 Now the just shall live by faith...*** We must see our picture in the scripture to have a better future.

Apostle Paul said in **2 Cor 4:13** *We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken; we also believe, and therefore speak.* Believe what God has said about the Christian and start acting on them. What God has said about you is true no matter what you are seeing or feeling in your life. Since eternity past, God has always kept His Word. Believe what He has said about you, then, think it, speak it, do it and live it.

Pr 4:20 *My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. 21 Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart. 22 For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.* His Word is our Life. What He says about us is truth and life.

In conclusion, believe in the ability of God and what He says about the Christian to live a victorious life.

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Baptism is from the Greek word Baptizo which means to submerge. There are about five major Basic Bible Baptisms. We are going to discuss them under three points (the agent, the element and the purpose). The agent of baptism refers to who administers the baptism. The element refers to what the person is baptized into. The purpose is what that baptism achieves.

- 1. Baptism of Repentance:** The agent of baptism was John the Baptist. The element used was water (*Matt 3:11 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with*

fire). The purpose of this baptism is for repentance (change of mind) to prepare the way for the Christ (***Isa 40:3 The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill shall be made low: and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough places plain: 5 And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it).***

In conclusion, this baptism ended with John the Baptist and has been replaced by the Christian baptism.

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

- 2. Baptism of Regeneration:** The agent is the Holy Spirit. The element is the body of Christ. The purpose of this baptism is for union with Christ (*1Cor 12:13 For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit. Eph 1:13 In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise. 14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory*). We have been

sealed in the body of Christ by the Holy Spirit. This is actually the new birth experience.

3. **Baptism of the Holy Spirit:** The agent of baptism is Jesus Christ and the element is the Holy Spirit. The purpose is for the initial infilling of the Holy Spirit (part of the new birth experience) and the initial “coming upon” of the Holy Spirit to empower the believer to live the new life in Christ.

When the gospel is preached to an unbeliever, the Holy Spirit is the one at that time convicting him/her to accept Christ so at that point the person is fully surrounded or submerged in the Holy Spirit. Thus, the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is actually part of the whole new birth process. It is actually the prerequisite because the only way for a sinner to be convicted is to be in the presence of (submerged in) the Holy Spirit at the time of the preaching of the gospel. However, the coming upon of the Holy Spirit on a believer with the evidence of speaking in tongues is generally considered as Holy Spirit baptism. So, this is how I put it; that the initial infilling and the coming of the Spirit upon a believer can both be considered as Holy Spirit baptism.

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. I thank you for the baptism into the body of Christ and the baptism of the Holy Spirit. I declare that I walk in the newness of life in Jesus' name. Amen.*

4. **Christian Baptism:** This baptism is commonly known as water baptism. The agent is any mature Christian usually an ordained minister. The element is water. The purpose of this baptism is that it signifies that we died and were buried together with Christ and we rose up together with him (*Col 2:12 Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead*).
5. **Baptism of Suffering:** This baptism is sometimes referred to as the baptism of fire. The agent is Jesus Christ. The element is self-denial, persecution and trials. The purpose is to be glorified and also test the genuineness of our faith. Some scriptural references include:

Php 1:29 For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake,

Rom 8:18 For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.

1Pe 1:6 Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations:7 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:

James 1:12 Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.

Rev 2:10 Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life.

In conclusion, apart from the first baptism (the baptism of repentance), all the other baptisms are essential for a complete Christian journey.

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: THE LAYING ON OF HANDS (PART ONE).

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Laying on of hands is very important in the Christian community. It has a whole lot of benefits. In laying on of hands, spirituals are imparted and not physicals. The spirituals may include; spiritual gifts, blessings, anointing, divine possibilities, etc.

Again, there is always a potential difference between the transferor and the receiver (***Hebrews 7:7 And without all contradiction the less is blessed of the better***). That is why in laying on of hands, it is mostly done on the head of the receiver to indicate that the transferor is in a higher authority and as such there should be a free-flow of spiritual substance to the receiver. Anyone you do not honour you cannot receive from that person.

Impartation strictly flows based on the law of honour (***Matt 13:54 And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, Whence hath this man this wisdom, and these mighty works? 55 Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas? 56 And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence then hath this man all these things? 57 And they were offended in him. But Jesus said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, save in his own country, and in his own house. 58 And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief.***) The people in Jesus' hometown failed to see him as the Christ, they were so familiar with him because they saw him grow among them. So, they dishonoured him and he could not do many mighty works there. Although impartation strictly thrives on the law of honour with the greater blessing the lesser. However, in some special cases, when given permission there can be a lateral (horizontal) or upward impartation or lack of a better word intercession from the lesser to the greater (which by observation and experience hands are not laid on the head of that higher authority).

Moreover, laying on of hands is not limited to humans. Hands can be laid on our lands, houses, cars, phones, businesses, food etc. In fact, anything useful for man can be dedicated to God or sanctified through the mystery of laying on of hands.

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: THE LAYING ON OF HANDS (PART TWO).

There are some biblical examples of laying on of hands and as such we are going to analyze some Biblical passages to know how the laying of hands was done and why it was done and what was imparted.

1. In the Old Testament, laying on of hands was used as a sign of substitution (*Lev 1:2 Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, If any man of you bring an offering unto the LORD, ye shall bring your offering of the cattle, even of the herd, and of the flock. 3 If his offering be a burnt sacrifice of the herd, let him offer a male without blemish: he shall offer it of his own voluntary will at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation before the LORD. 4 And he shall put his hand upon the head of the burnt offering; and it shall be accepted for him to make atonement for him*). However, Jesus being the perfect lamb of God came to take our sins forever so we do not need the blood of bulls and goats again to substitute for the punishment of our sins. Jesus has paid it all for us. Once and for all with his blood.

2. Laying on of hands was used to impart blessings: *Gen 48:13 And Joseph took them both, Ephraim in his right hand toward Israel's left hand, and Manasseh in his left hand toward Israel's right hand, and brought them near unto him. 14 And Israel stretched out his right hand, and laid it upon Ephraim's head, who was the younger, and his left hand upon Manasseh's head, guiding his hands wittingly; for Manasseh was the firstborn. 15 And he blessed Joseph, and said, God, before whom my fathers Abraham and Isaac did walk, the God which fed me all my life long unto this day, 16 The Angel which redeemed me from all evil, bless the lads; and let my name be named on them, and the name of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; and let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth.*

Matthew 19:13 Then were there brought unto him little children, that he should put his hands on them, and pray: and the disciples rebuked them. 14 But Jesus said, Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven. 15 And he laid his hands on them, and departed thence.

3. Laying on of hands was used to ordain people to leadership:
Deut 34:9 And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom; for Moses had laid his hands upon him: and the children of Israel hearkened unto him, and did as the LORD commanded Moses.

Acts 6:5 And the saying pleased the whole multitude: and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Ghost, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolas a proselyte of Antioch: 6 Whom they set before the apostles: and when they had prayed, they laid their hands on them.

Acts 13:1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. 3 And when they had fasted

and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away. They were commissioned for the assignment through the laying on of hands. However, note that Paul advised Timothy not to commission people suddenly (***1Tim 5:22 Lay hands suddenly on no man...***). This is because anyone you commission in the ministry, you are actually held accountable to an extent for the work he or she does in the kingdom. Hence, before you commission anyone, it should be inspired of God and the person must have proven his/herself to be counted a faithful servant of the Lord. The person must also be willing to submit under authority. Independence in ministry is a ministry killer disease that lands ministers into pride and erroneous teachings and inevitably a fall.

4. Laying on of hands was used to administer healing: ***Luke 4:40 Now when the sun was setting, all they that had any sick with divers diseases brought them unto him; and he laid his hands on every one of them, and healed them.***
Mark 16:17 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; 18 They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.

PRAYER: Father, I thank you for your Word today. I thank you for the power in laying of hands. I pray that I will be a beneficiary of this doctrine in my Christian journey in Jesus' name. Amen.

5. Laying on of hands was used for Holy Spirit In-filling: *Acts 19:5 When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. 6 And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied.* As soon as they believed and were baptized in the name of Jesus, they were born again so the Holy Spirit came to live in them but the infilling of the Holy Spirit through the agency of the laying on of hands made them speak with tongues and prophesied.

6. Laying on of hands was used to impart Spiritual gifts: *1 Timothy 4:14 Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery.* Laying on of hands is used to activate the spiritual gifts because the custodian of all spiritual gifts (the Holy Spirit) is in every believer. So, it is not like transferring externally from one believer to another but it is an inward activation through the mystery of laying on of hands.

In conclusion, there are many spiritual benefits associated with the laying on of hands and we must be able to enjoy these benefits fully.

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

In the early church, some charlatans and false teachers taught that the resurrection of the dead had passed and Paul through his first letter to the Corinthians addressed that subject. Hence, 1 Corinthians 15 is the key biblical passage for this doctrine. We will consider this doctrine under some key topics;

1. **The Resurrection of Jesus:** Jesus died and rose from the dead the third day. There is a difference between raising someone from the dead and resurrection. The former requires that a man from the earth call you back to the earth realm but the latter does not need any man in the earth realm to call you back. Jesus rose from the dead by the Holy Spirit without any

human intervention. The significance of the resurrection of Jesus (***1Cor 15:12 Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead? 13 But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen: 14 And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain. 15 Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not. 16 For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised: 17 And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins. 18 Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished. 19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable***). From this scripture seven arrows can be shot at Christianity if Jesus had not resurrected.

1. Our preaching is in vain.
2. Our faith is in vain/founded upon nothing.
3. All preachers are false witnesses of God.
4. We are yet in our sins.
5. Those who died in Christ are perished.
6. Christians are of all men most miserable.
7. The Holy Spirit baptism would not have been possible.

What the Resurrection of Jesus proofs

1. Jesus Christ is the son of God in power (Romans 1:4).
2. Jesus Christ is pre-eminent in all things (Col 1:18, Eph 1:20-22).
3. There is surely a resurrection of the dead for us (1 Cor 15:20-22).
4. There is eternal judgment, and Jesus is the judge of the living and the dead (Acts 17:30-31)
5. Jesus Christ is alive today. He can be experienced in a personal way (Heb 13:8)
6. The key of death and hades is in His hands. He has power to raise us up.
7. The second coming of Jesus Christ is sure (Matthew 27:62-66, Hebrews 9:28).

How to proof the Resurrection of Jesus

Philippians 2:9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Anything dead cannot respond to his or her name. In our anchor scripture, Apostle Paul declared that ‘**at the name of Jesus**’ which means as touching the name or any contact with the name whether by mentioning, writing or texting, every power should bow. Hence, when the name of Jesus is mentioned on the earth in any situation, there should be an effect upon the earth. This is how we proof that Jesus resurrected and He is alive. For this same reason that we received the Holy Spirit (who is the custodian of the power of God- **Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto**

me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth). The power of God is to make us witnesses of His resurrection but not to make a name for ourselves.

In conclusion, we are to proof the resurrection of our Lord Jesus by demonstrating the power of God.

1Thessa 4:16 For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: 17 Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. 18 Wherefore comfort one another with these words.

At the end of time, we shall all be changed and have glorious bodies like Christ when He resurrected (***Php 3:21 Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself***).

We have this hope therefore we labour. There is a great glory awaiting us in Christ.

In conclusion, we shall be like Christ when we see Him. We shall be raised up together with Him and we shall forever be with Him. He that is dead in Christ only sleeps awaiting a glorious hope in Christ.

BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES: ETERNAL JUDGMENT (PART ONE).

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

Eternal judgement is used to qualify any judgment outside the earth realm. It is God's justice or judgment being method out to His creation as a result of their deeds. All creation will be judged and this include angels, man, Satan, the wicked, etc.

Every man on earth will exist forever but where every man will spend his/her eternity is dependent on the short time he/she lived on the earth (***Heb 9:27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment***). This is why winning souls should be of top priority to any Christian. There are several forms of judgment and their timings. They include; the judgment on the cross, the daily judgement of

believers, the judgment seat of Christ, the judgment of the house of Israel, the white throne judgment (Rev 20:11-15), the judgment of angels (1 Cor 6:3 Know ye not that we shall judge angels? how much more things that pertain to this life?), and the judgement of the wicked. Some of the judgments are explained below;

1. The judgment on the cross: Jesus was judged for our sins. He took our place. *Isaiah 53:5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.* Thank you, Lord Jesus, for offering yourself for us.

2. The daily judgment or believers' judgment: *1 Cor 5:12 For what have I to do to judge them also that are without? do not ye judge them that are within? 13 But them that are without God judgeth. Therefore put away from among yourselves that wicked person.*

1Cor 6:4 If then ye have judgments of things pertaining to this life, set them to judge who are least esteemed in the church. 5 I speak to your shame. Is it so, that there is not a wise man among you? no, not one that shall be able to judge between his brethren?

PRAYER: *Father, I thank you for your Word today. I thank you for revealing to me the types of judgments. I declare that by this revelation, I prepare for eternity in grand style in Jesus' name. Amen.*

3. The judgment seat of Christ or the beamer seat judgment:

This the judgment of believers by Jesus Christ. At the end of our journey on earth, whatever work we did we will be rewarded (*1 Cor 9:25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible*). Remember that how much you can work is directly proportional to the glory you carry (the form you have built up). The judgment seat of Christ is extensively described in *1 Cor 3:10-14*. It is worthy to note here that there are different crowns available for believers at the beamer seat judgement and they are;

- **Crown of life:** James 1:12 Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him. Rev 2:10 Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye

may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life.

• **Crown of Righteousness:** 2Tim 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: 2Ti 4:8 Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

• **Crown of Glory:** 1 Pet 5:1-The elders which are among you I exhort, who am also an elder, and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that shall be revealed: 2 Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; 3 Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock. 4 And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away.

• **Crown of Rejoicing:** 1Thessa 2:19 For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming? Php 4:1 Therefore, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved.

***PRAYER:** Father, I thank you for your Word today. I pray for the grace to work and labour in Christ. Father, make me eternity conscious in Jesus' name. Amen.*

Rev 21:8 But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.

7. Judgment of Satan and all his cohorts including death:

The devil shall be judged and as such we must be more serious in winning souls so that he does not take many with him.

2 Peter 2:4 For if God spared not the angels that sinned, but cast them down to hell, and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment; Jude 1:6 And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, he hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day. Rev 20:14 And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.

PRAYER: Father, I thank you for your Word today. Father, make me a soul winner to depopulate hell in Jesus' name. Amen.
